United Way Manitowoc County Announces COVID-19 Basic Needs Relief Fund –
Phase 2 Recovery Grant Recipients

Manitowoc, Wisconsin (July 15, 2020) Today United Way Manitowoc County announced COVID-19 Basic Need Relief Fund – Phase 2 awardees. Eleven local nonprofit organizations are receiving relief monies totaling \$53,500 in support of critical programs and services to assist those in need as we begin to recover from the devastating impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

To date, United Way Manitowoc County has awarded a total of \$75,650 from their COVID-19 Basic Needs Relief Fund. Phase 1 funding provided Manitowoc County nonprofit and tax-exempt organizations with financial support to meet immediate critical basic needs of ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) households – those in our community who are living in poverty or are one crisis away from slipping into poverty. Phase 2 funds are focused on sustaining vital nonprofit programs and services as we all work together to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic.
