
COMMUNITY IMPACT

“The cost of renting a truck three times a week to deliver food to underserved rural communities is over \$600 every week. Every dollar we were awarded was used to procure trucks to move the 70,000 lbs. of food we receive on a weekly basis.”

“These funds enabled a CASA Advocate to consistently meet with a child in protective services who was experiencing a difficult time resulting in numerous out-of-county placements and in-patient treatment. We have also been able to conduct our first virtual preservice training for five new advocates, continue service for 21 children and supervise 18 advocates.”

“In the early months of the pandemic, most of our participants were unable to come to Ascend. We were able to provide Zoom sessions to our homebound participants. The funds we received enabled us to keep our connection with them and show that we care.”

“Since receiving this funding from United Way Manitowoc County, we have served 12 households including 42 individuals (17 adults and 25 children). Seven of the 12 households have successfully transitioned out of shelter, and six households have transitioned to permanent housing. The other household was appropriately relocated to our domestic violence center.”
